Heart

Good communication originates in the heart

Psalms 19:14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.

Power of Words

James 3:1 Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. 2 For we all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body. 3 If we put bits into the mouths of horses so that they obey us, we guide their whole bodies as well. 4 Look at the ships also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs.

Principles for Speaking: Sender/Communicator Communicate for clarity

- 1 Express clearly what you are thinking and feeling. Represent yourself.
- 2 Use "I" expressions. "I" think _____ (a thought)
- 3 Let what you Say, the Content, be truthful and intellectually honest
- 4 Let how you say it, in your Tone, be characterized by love and care
- 5 Have a sense of reflection in your tone of voice, an openness, as if you are simply sharing information
- 6 Keep your communication light, employ humor if possible, avoid sarcasm
- 7 Be emotionally honest "I" feel ______ (one word) afraid, scared, hopeful, happy
- 8 Not a debate or argument, not trying to convince. Not a Bully Pulpit Be careful to not overstate your convictions.
- 9 Avoid blaming, judging, or criticizing
- 10 Look in the mirror to see what your face looks like when speaking.

Good family communication built on healthy parents who practice this kind of communication. Model how to communicate, embody your own code, encourage children to apply within the family, practice
