“The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.” (Genesis 1:2)

“When You send forth Your Spirit, they are created, and You renew the face of the ground.” (Psalm 104:30)

Making and giving life.

“The Spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life.”
(Job 33:4)

Equipping Bezalel.

“I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with ability and intelligence, with knowledge and all craftsmanship.” (Exodus 31:3)

Coming upon Moses and the seventy elders of Israel.

“The LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied.” (Numbers 11:25)

Clothing, coming upon, and stirring Gideon, Othniel, Jephthah, and Samson.

“The Spirit of the LORD clothed Gideon, and he sounded the trumpet.”
(Judges 6:34)

“When the people of Israel cried out to the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer for the people of Israel, who saved them, Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb’s younger brother. The Spirit of the LORD was upon him, and he judged Israel.” (Judges 3:9–10)

“Then the Spirit of the LORD was upon Jephthah.” (Judges 11:29)

“The woman bore a son and called his name Samson. And the young man grew, and the LORD blessed him. And the Spirit of the LORD began to stir him.”
(Judges 13:24–25)

Coming upon David.

“Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers. And the Spirit of the LORD rushed upon David from that day forward.”
(1 Samuel 16:13)

Speaking through David.

“The Spirit of the LORD speaks by me; His word is on my tongue.” (2 Samuel 23:2)

Coming upon Azariah and the prophets.

“The Spirit of God came upon Azariah the son of Oded.” (2 Chronicles 15:1)

“You bore with them and warned them by Your Spirit through Your prophets.”
(Nehemiah 9:30)

Clothing Zechariah.

“Then the Spirit of God clothed Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest.”
(2 Chronicles 24:20)

Instructing the children of Israel in the wilderness.

“You gave Your Good Spirit to instruct them.” (Nehemiah 9:20)

Giving the children of Israel rest in the wilderness.

“Then He remembered the days of old, of Moses and his people. Where is He Who brought them up out of the sea with the shepherds of his flock? Where is He Who put in the midst of them His Holy Spirit, Who caused His glorious arm to go at the right hand of Moses, Who divided the waters before them to make for Himself an everlasting name, Who led them through the depths? Like a horse in the desert, they did not stumble. Like livestock that go down into the valley, the Spirit of the LORD gave them rest.” (Isaiah 63:11–14)

Being ever-present.

“Where shall I go from Your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from Your presence?”
(Psalm 139:7)

Leading me.

“Teach me to do Your will, for You are my God! Let Your Good Spirit lead me on level ground!” (Psalm 143:10)

Being poured out and revealing God’s Word.

“If you turn at my reproof, behold, I will pour out My spirit upon you; I will make My words known to you.” (Proverbs 1:23 ASV)

Bearing fruit.

“Until the Spirit is poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness becomes a fruitful field, and the fruitful field is deemed a forest.” (Isaiah 32:15)

Being poured out on our offspring.

“I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour My Spirit upon your offspring, and My blessing on your descendants.” (Isaiah 44:3)

Energizing and speaking to Ezekiel.

“As He spoke to me, the Spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard Him speaking to me.” (Ezekiel 2:2)

Being in us and causing us to be obedient.

“I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put My Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in My statutes and be careful to obey My rules.” (Ezekiel 36:26–27)

Giving life to dry bones.

“The hand of the LORD was upon me, and He brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones.... ‘And I will put My Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land. Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the LORD.’” (Ezekiel 37:1, 14)

Being poured out on all flesh.

“I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female servants in those days I will pour out My Spirit.” (Joel 2:28–29)

Being mighty and powerful.

“This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the LORD of hosts.” (Zechariah 4:6)

Resting upon Jesus.

“The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.” (Isaiah 11:2)

“Behold My servant, Whom I uphold, My chosen, in Whom My soul delights; I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations.” (Isaiah 42:1)

“The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to bring good news to the poor; He has sent Me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound.” (Isaiah 61:1)

Conceiving Jesus.

“When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit.” (Matthew 1:18)

“An angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.” (Matthew 1:20)

Descending upon Jesus.

“When Jesus was baptized, immediately He went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on Him.” (Matthew 3:16)

Leading Jesus.

“Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.” (Matthew 4:1)

Giving Jesus power to cast out demons.

“It is by the Spirit of God that I cast out demons.” (Matthew 12:28)

Helping Jesus rejoice.

“In that same hour He rejoiced in the Holy Spirit.” (Luke 10:21)

Teaching disciples what to say.

“The Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say.” (Luke 12:12)

Helping disciples speak.

“It is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you.” (Matthew 10:20)

Revealing truth.

“These things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For who knows a person’s thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit Who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God.” (1 Corinthians 2:10–12)

Teaching all things and reminding us what Jesus said.

“The Helper, the Holy Spirit, Whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.” (John 14:26)

Bearing witness about Jesus.

“When the Helper comes, Whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, Who proceeds from the Father, He will bear witness about Me.” (John 15:26)

Glorifying Jesus.

“He will glorify Me, for He will take what is Mine and declare it to you.” (John 16:14)

Guiding us into all truth.

“When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all the truth, for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak, and He will declare to you the things that are to come.” (John 16:13)

“You have been anointed by the Holy One, and you all have knowledge.”
(1 John 2:20)

“The anointing that you received from Him abides in you, and you have no need that anyone should teach you. But as His anointing teaches you about everything, and is true, and is no lie—just as it has taught you, abide in Him.” (1 John 2:27)

Baptizing believers.

“I baptize you with water for repentance, but He Who is coming after me is mightier than I, Whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.” (Matthew 3:11)

Giving Christ-followers a new birth.

“Jesus answered, ‘Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, “You must be born again.” The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.’” (John 3:5–8)

Giving life.

“It is the Spirit Who gives life.” (John 6:63)

“If Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of Him Who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He Who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit Who dwells in you.” (Romans 8:10–11)

“The letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.” (2 Corinthians 3:6)

“Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the Spirit.”
(1 Peter 3:18)

Being the Source of living water.

“On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, ‘If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. Whoever believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, “Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.” Now this He said about the Spirit, Whom those who believed in Him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.’” (John 7:37–39)

Being with us forever.

“I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, to be with you forever.” (John 14:16)

Convicting the world of sin.

“I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send Him to you. And when He comes, He will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment.” (John 16:7–8)

Speaking to us.

“Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, ‘Today, if you hear His voice....’” (Hebrews 3:7)

“He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.” (Rev. 2:7)

“The Spirit said to Philip, ‘Go over and join this chariot.’ ... And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing.” (Acts 8:29, 39)

“The Spirit told me to go with them.” (Acts 11:12)

“While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, ‘Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.’” (Acts 13:2)

“Behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me.” (Acts 20:22–23)

Pouring God’s love into our hearts.

“God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit Who has been given to us.” (Romans 5:5)

Setting us free.

“The law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death.” (Romans 8:2)

“The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.” (2 Corinthians 3:17)

Life and partnership with the Spirit.

“If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.” (Galatians 5:25)

Leading us.

“For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.” (Romans 8:14)

“Let your good Spirit lead me on level ground!” (Psalm 143:10)

Re-setting our thinking.

“Those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit.” (Romans 8:5)

Putting the flesh to death.

“If by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.” (Rom. 8:13)

“I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.” (Gal. 5:16–18)

Making us know we are adopted children of God.

“For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by Whom we cry, ‘Abba! Father!’ The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God.” (Romans 8:14–16)

“Because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, ‘Abba! Father!’” (Galatians 4:6)

Helping us pray.

“Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.” (Eph. 6:18)

“Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And He Who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.” (Romans 8:26–27)

“Building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit.” (Jude 20)

Righteousness, peace, and joy.

“The kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.” (Romans 14:17)

Hope.

“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.” (Romans 15:13)

Delivering words of power.

“My speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power.” (1 Corinthians 2:4)

Bringing forth words with conviction.

“Our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction.” (1 Thessalonians 1:5)

Cleansing, justification, and sanctification.

“You were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.” (1 Corinthians 6:11)

“We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth.” (2 Thessalonians 2:13)

“According to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in the sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and for sprinkling with His blood.” (1 Peter 1:2)

Regeneration and renewal.

“He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit.” (Titus 3:5)

Enabling believers to affirm Jesus is Lord.

“Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking in the Spirit of God ever says ‘Jesus is accursed!’ and no one can say ‘Jesus is Lord’ except in the Holy Spirit.” (1 Corinthians 12:3)

Empowering the body of Christ with spiritual gifts.

“To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit....All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, Who apportions to each one individually as He wills.” (1 Corinthians 12:7–9, 11)

Confessing that Jesus is God Incarnate.

“By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God.” (1 John 4:2)

Bearing witness.

“God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to His will.” (Hebrews 2:4)

Sealing us.

“Who has also put His seal on us and given us His Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee.” (2 Corinthians 1:22)

“Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by Whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.” (Ephesians 4:30)

Your fellowship.

“The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.” (2 Corinthians 13:14)

Being received through faith.

“In Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promised Spirit through faith.” (Galatians 3:14)

Your good fruit.

“The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control....” (Galatians 5:22–23)

The harvest of eternal life.

“The one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.” (Galatians 6:8)

Unity.

“Maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call.” (Eph. 4:3–4)

Filling us.

“Be filled with the Spirit....” (Ephesians 5:18)

The Word of God.

“Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God.” (Ephesians 6:17)

Inspiring the Word of God.

“No prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.” (2 Peter 1:21)

For deliverance.

“I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance.” (Philippians 1:19)

Inspired worship.

“We are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus.” (Philippians 3:3)

Joy.

“You became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the Word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit.” (1 Thessalonians 1:6)

Power, love, and discipline.

“God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.” (2 Timothy 1:7)

Enabling Jesus to offer Himself without blemish.

“How much more will the blood of Christ, Who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to serve the living God.” (Hebrews 9:14)

Resting on us when we are insulted.

“If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you.” (1 Peter 4:14)

Confirming we are abiding in Jesus.

“Whoever keeps His commandments abides in God, and God in Him. And by this we know that He abides in us, by the Spirit Whom He has given us.” (1 John 3:24)

“We know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His Spirit.” (1 John 4:13)

Bringing us into harmony with You.

“The Spirit and the Bride say, ‘Come.’ And let the one who hears say, ‘Come.’ And let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price.” (Revelation 22:17)
